

HURST CRIME FIGURES

As the figures show, the Hurst ward suffered a slight rise in burglary dwelling, theft of motor vehicle and drug offences during the last quarter of the year, compared to the same period of 2016. But on a positive note, we saw a decrease in burglary other than a dwelling, vehicle interference and quite a significant drop in theft from motor vehicles.

Despite these positives, we still need Hurst residents to be vigilant and ensure that your property is as secure as it can possibly be. Don't leave your doors and/or windows unlocked, remove all valuable from display inside your vehicle and ensure you report anything you feel looks suspicious, via the 101 number.

COURT ORDER OBTAINED BY NEW CHARTER



On 12th December, New Charter Housing Trust obtained an injunction order against Craig Kelly 33yrs, of no fixed abode, at Manchester County Court.

The order, which is in place for 12 months, forbids Kelly from entering Hampson Place or Hampson Road, Ashton-under-Lyne, from engaging in conduct that causes nuisance or annoyance to any person occupying residential premises in Hampson Place or Hampson Road and from engaging in or threatening to engage in the use of or threats of violence against any other persons.

A breach of this order may lead to Kelly being arrested and placed before the court

Kelly's order has come as a result of the joint partnership working between New Charter Housing Tenancy Enforcement and the GMP Ashton Hurst team.
